Celebrate Earth Day April 22, 2023 With Free Compost

In celebration of Earth Day, North Lincoln Sanitary Service is again providing free compost!

- One Pickup Load Per Customer (while supplies last)
- Event at Public Transfer Station from 10:00 am - 3:00 pm

Each year, yard debris and mixed compostables are collected locally and hauled to an organics processor in the Willamette Valley, where it is ground up and made into rich garden compost. Diverting this waste saves tons of landfill space and produces a quality product for farmers and gardeners to enrich their soils. Local haulers are celebrating Earth Day by trucking back some of this rich finished product for their customers to use in their gardens.

Remember, compost is a soil amendment. Sprinkle about 1/2-inch compost around garden beds or spread compost up to 2 inches deep if you turn the compost deep into the soil. Never put plants directly into compost.

Cool Fact

The mixed compostables and yard debris collected at the curb is usually finished compost in just 70 days!

- **Haven 2** – permit issued 11/30/2022 and work in progress for the motel conversion to apartment units/commercial at 1091 SE 1st
- **Innovative Housing Inc. – 107-unit affordable housing project** - northeast corner of NE 25th and Hwy 101 – Construction in Progress

Violations will be Class C misdemeanors that include fines. Styrofoam is a major source of ocean pollution. It breaks down into microplastic pieces that literally take thousands of years to fully decompose.

Oregon will lift mask requirement for health care settings April 3

Salem, Ore.— Workers, patients and visitors in health care settings will no longer be required to wear masks starting April 3, Oregon Health Authority (OHA) announced.

OHA is rescinding provisions in Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 333-019-1011 that require workers in health care settings – such as hospitals, mobile clinics, ambulances, outpatient facilities, dental offices, urgent care centers, counseling offices, school-based health centers, complementary and alternative medicine locations – to wear masks. The requirement has been in effect since August 2021.

In addition, Executive Order 22-24 will expire on March 6, 2023. The emergency gave hospitals needed flexibility to respond to a surge in respiratory infections, including COVID-19, RSV and influenza.
