Curbside Recycling

Newspaper

Place in cart loose. Please do not tie or bag.

Corrugated Cardboard

Flatten all the boxes.

Scrap Paper

This includes magazines, catalogs, junk mail, and cereal boxes, etc. Place in cart loose.

Tin Cans & Aluminum Cans

Rinse well and place in cart loose.

Plastics

#1 & #2 jugs & bottles only.

Remove lids, rinse well, place in cart loose.

Motor Oil

Place next to cart in jug with screw on lid.

Urban Renewal Agency

Lincoln City Economic Development has drafted the Proposed Nelscott Urban Renewal Area Plan. The goals of this Plan include building transportation infrastructure for new roadway connections/emergency routes off Highway 101, and public improvement projects to support housing and living-wage job production. Public input for the draft Plan has included an advisory committee, two Community Open Houses and an online survey. Next, the Plan will go to the Urban Renewal Agency and Planning Commission for review and then be considered for adoption by the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners and City Council this summer.

If adopted, the Nelscott Urban Renewal Plan will be the City's second current Urban Renewal Area. City Council adopted the Road's End / Villages at Cascade Head Urban Renewal Plan in 2020.
