Oregon E-cycles program

The Oregon E-cycles program accepts the following items at no charge:

- Old Televisions
- Old Desktop Computers
- Laptop Computers
- Computer Tablets
- Computer Monitors
- Printers
- Computer Keyboards
- Computer Mice



Your local hauler is set up as an Oregon e-cycles Program Location. That means that you can self-haul to their e-cycles site – and best of there no charge to drop these items off. Please note that the Oregon E-cycles Program does not accept other types of electronic devices such as stereo speakers, scanners, game consoles, or appliances.

How It Works

Oregon E-Cycles is an example of a product stewardship program, where the company that makes the device is responsible for recycling their products. Manufacturers must then imbed the costs of recycling their products as part of the cost of doing business. DEQ maintains a list of manufacturers and their compliance status for this purpose.

In 2010 Oregon created a disposal ban on computers, monitors and TVs. This means these items need to be recycled and not just sent to the landfill. So, the E-cycles program identified locations across Oregon to recycle and dispose of this select group of electronic devices. These devices are made with valuable materials that can be recycled into new products. These electronics may also contain toxic materials such as lead, cadmium and mercury. Taking your device to e-cycles location helps ensure your device is handled properly and harmful toxins are kept out of our air, soil and water.

Oh, and reminder to remove any personal information stored on computer hard drives before taking devices to an E-cycles location.

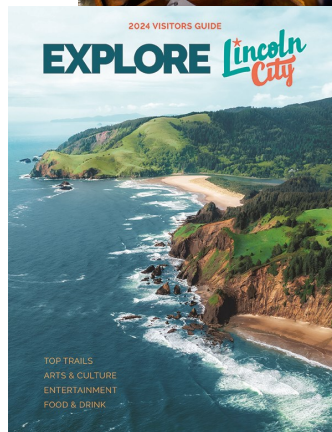
