Got Junk?

Help stop illegal dumping by using a service where your stuff won't get lost in the woods!

When you hire someone to haul off old junk—old refrigerators, washer/dryers, couches, etc.—it is a good idea to ensure that your stuff gets disposed of properly. Here are three easy ways to get it off your hands.

Your Franchised Hauler. If you just want to pay to have someone take your unwanted stuff away, your local franchised hauler is the best deal in town. They can offer you a variety of methods and services in the form of drop boxes, bins, or haul-away. Our local franchised hauler is North Lincoln Sanitary Service. This is the only company licensed to haul old junk (solid waste) in our area (other than neighboring franchised haulers). Not only can you be assured of reliable rates, you also can rely on their equipment, facilities, and practices to be regularly inspected for compliance with federal, state, and local regulations. Also, for those able or wanting to do so, there is always the option to self-haul materials to a local transfer station. Your regular waste hauler can also help with information and tips for self-hauling.

Like-For-Like. When you purchase a new item from a reputable company, it is okay to have the delivery driver haul away the old one. For example, if you buy a bed and refrigerator, they'll deliver them, and then haul away your old bed and refrigerator as part of your purchase. In this case, the haul-away is incidental to their business. Please note that not all businesses offer this service, so if this is important to you, be sure to ask them.

YOU get paid. Your trash may be someone else's treasure. Someone may offer to buy something you are disposing of, and you agree on a fair price. You need no longer be concerned with the item, and anyone offering money for something is much less likely to dump it illegally. This is a win-win all around: for you, the buyer, *and* the environment.

NOTE: Other junk haulers (national companies or Mom and Pop businesses) may be licensed in some areas of the country, but they are not licensed to haul anywhere in our area. If you are concerned about services being offered to you, please contact code law enforcement or your franchised hauler.

Plastic Foam Food Container Ban

The ban on foam polystyrene containers went into effect on **April 13th, 2021**. Since **July 13th, 2021**, the ban on foam polystyrene food containers is enforced. Violations will be Class C misdemeanors that include fines. Styrofoam is a major source of ocean pollution. It breaks down into microplastic pieces that literally take thousands of years to fully decompose.
